#### **OPTIONAL REGISTRATION FOR WEEKEND MASSES**

To help eliminate the last-minute crunch at the weekend Masses, and allow our wonderful volunteers the opportunity to celebrate Mass, we have introduced optional registration for weekend Mass. Those who are registered will be guaranteed a seat for Mass, provided you arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the commencement of Mass. Anyone not registered or arriving less than 15 minutes prior to Mass, will be seated until we reach our capacity, or when the doors are locked 5 minutes prior to Mass.

#### PARKING LOT UPDATE

St. Albert the Great Parish has experienced unwanted visitors partying in our parking lot late at night. This disturbs our neighbors and could present a potential danger to our assets and our neighbors. When the ground has thawed, we intend to install gates to prevent access to trespassers. In the meantime we have retained Paladin Security to patrol our parking lot, secure the church building and identify and remove trespassers. We are also looking into having screw piles installed at the entrances so that we can put up chains to close off the parking lot in the evenings. This would allow us to keep the east entrances blocked off except for weekend masses, leaving the west entrance open while the church is open and locking it at night. We appreciate the patience of our neighbors and our parishioners as we work on solving this problem.

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

As we celebrate this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can study His actions at the Jordan River as a powerful example of servant leadership. We see in Jesus a type of leadership that is characterized by humility and leading by example.

Certainly, the sinless Savior did not need a baptism of repentance! But Jesus humbly made Himself one with his people to draw us to Him and create a relationship with us so that we would be open to His teachings and influence. As a servant leader, we also see that Jesus leads by example. He doesn't just tell the people they need to be baptized. He shows them how and does it Himself to teach them. To lead like Jesus, we, too, must "walk the walk" and not just "talk the talk." If we want those who we lead to be generous and hard-working, then we must show them how to do this by demonstrating generosity and hard work ourselves.

Immediately after His baptism, we learn of the powerful affirmation of the Father who opens the heavens, sends the Holy Spirit upon Jesus in bodily form, and says audibly, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased." Let us be filled with gratitude for our amazing God and be reminded that when we are grateful followers of Jesus and servant-leaders in imitation of Him, the Father will be well-pleased with us, too.

The Calgary Catholic School District (CCSD) offers quality Catholic education in safe, supportive and inclusive communities. We are proud to provide a diverse range of programs, services and exciting learning opportunities to meet your child's unique needs.

#### Kindergarten

All Calgary Catholic elementary schools offer a half-day kindergarten program. A child who turns five years old on or before December 31, 2022, is eligible to register for kindergarten in the fall of that same calendar year. Your child's birth certificate is required at the time of registration.

#### Grade 1

A child who turns six years old on or before December 31, 2022, is eligible to register for Grade 1 in the fall of that same calendar year. The child's birth certificate is required and one parent's Catholic baptismal certificate is requested at the time of registration. Children do not need to register for Grade 1 if they attended kindergarten at the same school.

#### **Early French Immersion**

The French Immersion program enables students to develop functional fluency in French. No background in French is necessary. Entry point into this program is in kindergarten or Grade 1.

#### **Fine Arts**

The Fine Arts are comprised of art, drama and music. Students are involved as creators, performers, historians, critics and consumers. This program is offered at the elementary level at St. Augustine School, St. Dominic School and St. Philip School.

#### **Italian Language and Culture**

Students in this program will develop Italian language and communication skills and will participate in various cultural activities. Students may enter this program in kindergarten or in Grade 1. This program is offered at the elementary level at St. Alphonsus School and St. Maria Goretti School.

#### Online Learning

Online learning is available for students in grades 1-9 at St. Isidore School, our first virtual school. Curriculum mandated by Alberta Education will be followed and students will participate in daily classes. At St. Isidore School, Catholic education remains a key focus and appropriate resources are used to support student Faith development.

#### **Spanish Bilingual**

This program allows students to gain insight into the Spanish language and the culture of Spanish-speaking countries around the world. Entry point into this program is in kindergarten or Grade 1. This program is offered at the elementary level at St. Benedict School, St. John Paul II School and St. Margaret School.

#### **Diverse Learning Needs**

Students with diverse learning needs are asked to register at their local school. Through a referral process, a student's diverse learning needs are identified and discussed in order to help determine how best to support that student.
