



OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY OCTOBER 7

On October 7, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the yearly feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Known for several centuries by the alternate title of "Our Lady of Victory," the feast day takes place in honor of a 16th century naval victory which secured Europe against Turkish invasion. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was invoked on the day of the battle through a campaign to pray the Rosary throughout Europe.

The feast always occurs one week after the similar Byzantine celebration of the Protection of the Mother of God, which most Eastern Orthodox Christians and Eastern Catholics celebrate on October 1 in memory of a 10th-century military victory which protected Constantinople against invasion after a reported Marian apparition.

Pope Leo XIII was particularly devoted to Our Lady of the Rosary, producing 11 encyclicals on the subject of this feast and its importance in the course of his long pontificate. In the first of them, 1883's "Supremi Apostolatus Officio," he echoed the words of the oldest known Marian prayer (known in the Latin tradition as the "Sub Tuum Praesidium"), when he wrote, "It has always been the habit of Catholics in danger and in troublesome times to fly for refuge to Mary." *Except taken from The Catholic News Agency Website: Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

This annual demonstration brings awareness to the ongoing injustice of abortion and the harm it inflicts on mothers, fathers, and the community at large. It is a simple but powerful reminder to our fellow citizens of our duty to defend the weakest members of our society.

On the day of the event, those participating in Life Chain will stand at various predetermined intersections for one hour in quiet prayer, holding non-graphic signs with slogans like: "Abortion Kills Children," "Abortion Hurts Women," "Adoption: A Loving Option, and "Jesus Forgives & Heals." The signs are distributed and collected by a local organizer. This organizer will direct participants and liaise with any law enforcement, business owners, or media.

When we read about persecuted Christians around the world, it is easy to feel helpless. Yet we are not, for here at St. Albert the Great, we have been able to make a real difference!

One year ago, Camilla, Clara, and Catrina arrived in Canada after fleeing Iran because of persecution of their Catholic faith. Since then, thanks to our parish's support and their own dedication, they have learned English, adjusted to a new culture, and found part-time work; all while continuing to heal from trauma and separation from loved ones. The financial help, food from St. Vincent de Paul, friendship of parishioners, and the prayers of our community have made an immense difference in their lives.

The family recently moved to a downtown apartment closer to transit and work. Our parish has also applied to sponsor Camilla and Clara's father and Clara's husband. Financial support will be provided when they arrive, though it will be reduced as the sisters contribute more through their work income.

Camilla shares: "One year ago Clara was in a deportation camp, and my mom and I could not eat from fear. Finding a job has been really hard, but we are happy in Canada—we are safe, God is with us, and we will never forget your kindness and the love you showed our family, you are the light of Christ! Thank you so much, may God bless you always."
