

BAPTISM VOLUNTEERS NEEDED


Are you looking for a way to help/volunteer but don't have a great deal of time to commit? We have the perfect ministry for you!

THEY CAN'T PRAY FOR THEMSELVES

As we come to the end of November, the month dedicated to the Holy souls in purgatory The Catholic Company.com reminds us that They suffer in silence. But not without hope. The Holy Souls in Purgatory are our brothers and sisters, and many of them have no one praying for them. They cannot pray for themselves. But we can. And our prayers can speed them on their way to heaven.

What is Purgatory—and why does it matter? The Catechism teaches that Purgatory is a place of purification for souls who have died in a state of grace but still need healing before entering the perfect holiness of Heaven:

"After death, [some souls] undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." (CCC 1030)

It is a place of **mercy**, not punishment. And most importantly—it is a place where **our love and prayers are incredibly important**. There are countless verified stories of apparitions from Purgatory, including souls who beg for prayers and sacrifices to speed them on their way to heaven.

The most common prayer that can be said was given to us by St. Gertrude.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.
